

Northern Territory Social Outcomes Framework

Note that this is a population level outcomes framework and population outcomes and indices are used to measure it. We have adapted it here to assist community services where they are required to align outcomes to this. While we have selected those outcomes with the strongest alignment, community services can select some or all of the outcomes proposed, or add different outcomes from the Tree that align to their service focus and the NT social outcomes framework.
